As the Day Camp Leader – Recreation, you will oversee all aspects of daily camp operations—from activity planning to staff supervision—to ensure smooth, high-quality programming. Key responsibilities are as follows:

- Provide coaching, conduct performance evaluations, and support staff development to maintain a positive, inclusive team environment.
- Ensure strict adherence to safety protocols, emergency procedures, and required staff-to-camper ratios.
- Oversee administrative tasks, including attendance tracking, budgeting, expense management, and program reporting.
- Serve as the primary point of contact for parents, guardians, and community partners, providing updates and supporting inquiries.
- Coordinate facilities, equipment, and resources to maintain safe, clean, and well-prepared recreation spaces.
- Collaborate with internal teams to promote camp initiatives and support broader organizational goals.

- Deliver day camps (e.g., March Break Camp, Weekend Camp, and Summer Camp) and other virtual and in-person educational programs across the Greater Toronto Area.

Requirements:

- Experience in recreation programming, youth leadership, or camp coordination.
- Strong organizational, planning, and management skills.
- Strong relationship-building skills with families and community partners.
- A valid Standard First Aid with CPR-C certification and a clear Vulnerable Sector Check are required prior to start date (not reimbursed).
- Candidates must be between 15–30 years of age, a Canadian citizen/permanent resident/refugee protection status, and have a valid SIN.

Assets:

- Fluency in multiple languages (reading, writing, speaking, and listening).
- Access to a vehicle and a valid Ontario driver's license.

This is a fully in-person position. Salary ranges from \$18–26/hour, dependent on experience, skills, education, and role.
